She spent most of her high school life with relatives who would hide her. Her mother sold milk to secretly keep her in school. She recently joined college for training as a tailor and has since reconciled with her father. Samson & Hellen our Kenya BBRF team presented Jacklin the sewing machine for her course. She is very grateful for your love and care.

Expanding and Refocusing our Efforts – A Revised Vision

We have recently completed an intense review of our purpose, what we have accomplished over the past number of years and how we want to move forward within the scope and limitations of our fundraising capacity. This led us to a revitalized, mission, vision, and value statement as reported above. It is difficult to manage our emotional attachment towards helping as many girls as possible while recognizing our financial constraints. To this end, the board has decided to focus on supporting the girls in obtaining a grade 12 education and as funds permit, we will support as many as we can in their post-secondary endeavors. We will maintain a focus on supporting girls at AIC Kajiado School as we have done for 25 years, however, we have expanded our reach to other disadvantaged girls attending in other schools in Kenya. You will see the amalgamation of Friends of AIC Kajiado Society into Beyond Bride Rescue Foundation to reflect our support for girls in many areas of Kenya, not just Kajiado. Please know we haven't changed a thing in what we are doing, just simplifying and focusing... thank you for coming along with us!

A Glimpse into the Impact You Have Made!

The Bride Rescue Program works closely with several schools, in particular AIC Kajiado Girls School, a boarding school south of Nairobi, which accommodates 700 students mostly from the Maasai community. This unique program rescues young girls from harmful cultural practices such as female genital mutilation (circumcision) and early forced marriage which is quite common. The fathers, uncles or brothers marry the girls off in exchange for a dowry of cows and money. With the help of the Bride Rescue Program the girls come on their own accord to the school to receive an education which empowers them for a better life and lifts up their village or community... very powerful!

Your partnership is key in helping Kenyan girls and young women to secure an education. Here is a snapshot of how your gifts have made an impact.

Your donation pays for • educational fees, • boarding – yearround accommodation as these girls cannot go back home for fear of being married off, abused or circumcised • food, • clothing – uniforms, clothes for holiday times • Personal hygiene products • Training in skills such as cooking, embroidery, and beadwork, (allows them to earn a little money for their personal needs) • Trauma Counselling • An awareness of the lasting effects of early marriage on other girls in their community.

Straight from the girls



Glady's in Grade 8 writes: We are many in the home and all the cows died and I fear my father might force me to marry so that he can get cows because the drought finished all the livestock we had. I would like to be a teacher so that I can teach little children in my village.

Yolanda in Grade 6 writes: I fear to be married off because in our home we have no cows or goats. My parents are poor. I hope to reconcile with my family because sometimes I miss them.

Stephany in Grade 3 writes: I need help because my parents do not support education for girls, so they wanted to marry me off. I wanted to be rescued so I can get educated and go back to my community and teach them the importance of education. After I would like to be reconciled with my family.

Margaret in Grade 7 writes: My father refused to let me get educated. He wanted me and my sisters to be married so he can get money and cows. We ran to AIC Kajiado last year.

Grace in grade 4 writes: I was about to be circumcised, I refused but they still tried to force me.

My aunt brought a lady (Hellen) from the school. She was a beautiful as the sunset and she brought me to the AIC rescue centre. I want to be a lawyer so that I can fight for the rights for Kenyan citizens.



Dealing with Trauma

AIC Kajiado Girls School, among other schools that we support, is a boarding school. When the rescued girls come to the school, they are traumatized and must undergo serious counseling. Once at the school, the girls join the 'speak out club', whereby they compose poems, songs and plays that are geared towards creating awareness on early marriage and girl child education to the community. This program is invaluable to their mental and physical health. New students receiving supplies & some other necessities for the school year from our Program Administrator- Hellen





Food Security

BBRF provides an important element with ongoing food and shelter. When school is not in session, the girls cannot return home for fear of being married off or circumcised. The girls stay at the school where they have a home and food in their tummy's. This was a critical area of our support during the pandemic and continues as a result of dramatic food inflation and shortages. Many studies that show the importance of a nutritious meals towards learning outcomes. Our **annual food support program budget is \$8,500 CDN**. This provides beans, rice and ugali (corn meal) and cabbage. Meat, fruit and milk are an occasional luxury.
